### Minutes

- Present Graham White (Chair), Liz Keen (Vice Chair) Cllr Elliott, Cllr Lane, Ermin Ward Cllr J Judd and 1 parishioner. No apologies.
- 2 Declaration of interests. None
- 3 Minutes of last meeting. The minutes were agreed and signed by Chairman

Matters arising from minutes.

(i) Update on Highways matters.

Potholes, silt traps and drainage grips

It was felt that the quality of pothole repairs has improved under the new contractor but the Warren's Gorse still has very deep potholes along the edges of the road. Chairman to contact Highways.

The road surfaces from A429 into the village have also been repaired to a good standard.

White line opposite Wains Rd junction.

Cllr Elliott raised the issue of the white H line at the junction of Wains Rd. A cheque and letter has been sent to GCC Highways.

The kerbing work on the left side of the road entering Lower End has been completed to a high standard.

(ii) Up-date on defibrillator.

Checked September and October. Plaque to acknowledge funding from CDC. Clerk to add our defibrillator to Heartsafe App.

(iii) Up-date on broadband installations.

Cllr Lane has contacted Fastershire – no response yet. It was decided to invite Ben Stone from Gigaclear to next meeting. C Price to assist.

(iv) Up-date on tree plaque.

Tree plaque and post has been replaced by our Tree Warden Tim Donohue. Many thanks to Tim.

(v) Up-date on footpath from Riding School to Stratton.

This has now been cleared. Parishioner has thanked PC.

Repair to fencing along riding stables – Bathurst to be contacted.

(vi) Up-date on High path and 50/50 costs.

Invoice has now been sent to Highways to reclaim the 50% for Autumn 2018 and Spring 2019 high path mowing.

- (vii) Up-date on power outages.
  Cllr Lane reported that the outages are still occurring where the supply company have repaired cables after pruning trees. He will keep the PC up to date with any progress and communications.
- (viii) Update on Towards 2020 (End of WW11) There is proposed a 1940's themed 'Tea Party' with an opportunity to reflect. The PC felt that a £300 donation towards the celebration could be made if needed, but will work with the Village Hall Committee to pursue funding from the Communities Activities support grant, which might raise the amount deadline 13<sup>th</sup> January 2010. Cllr Elliott and Clerk to follow up.

## QUESTIONS FROM THE PUBLIC

4 Damaged Oak tree along 40 Acre field footpath.

Following the clerk's communications with The Duchy of Cornwall – the tree is to be replaced. The clerk also thanked The Duchy for the splendid repair of the walls near the telephone box.

The PC is to encourage Parishioners to report potholes to the free pothole hotline 08000514514 or Gloucestershire.gov.uk/reportit. Clerk to contact Web manager to add it to the Village website

Clerk to contact Parish Warden to discuss role and determine whether help can be obtained with items such as damaged styles along footpaths

Julia Judd presented a very helpful summary of items that might be beneficial to the PC to date and in future.

- Communities Activities Fund (WWII Commemoration)
- Communities Project Fund Look into subsidising boiler replacement 25% CDC
- New Planning permissions will now have to include infrastructure levy £80.00 /m² for any footprint > 100 m² Parish Council will then get 15% to spend within 5yrs.
- Possibility of an electric car charging point in Village Hall car park to raise revenue
- Cirencester Hospital is to be up-graded to an Urgent Treatment Centre
